Kilmurrays Minister to Vets in Music, Caring and Conversation

God and country are more than just slogans for Kevin Kilmurray and his wife, Donna. For both of them, it's a way of life. "My childhood was pretty darn good," Kevin says. "We lived out in the country along a two lane state highway, in an area that is really the start of the Allegheny mountains. So in the summer we had beautiful places to hike and in the winter great places to sled."

In seventh grade, Kevin joined a radio club at school and had the opportunity to work various jobs — including DJ and sports reporting — on weekends. That training would prove to be a godsend in later life. In high school, Kevin's radio experience translated to paper and he worked a sports beat for his hometown newspaper.

After college, Kevin worked for a while as a police office and, when he joined the Army in his mid-20s, he became a Corrections Specialist. For most of his military career, he was stationed at Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas,

After he left the Army, Kevin returned to public service working in prison administration at the Kansas State Penitentiary, as a dispatcher and Reserve Police Sergeant for Leavenworth Police Department and with the City of Overland Park Public Works Department where he retired.

. It was about then that internet radio became a possibility and the idea of it rekindled the interest in radio he had had from his middle school days. Also, about the same time, he was introduced to the Branson music scene and right away he wanted to do internet radio based on Branson's musical entertainment industry. He began working on setting up media for that and, in the process, was introduced to Rick Ramsey, who was working to create Acts Radio, the beginnings of Acts Media. Kevin moved to Branson in support of his own project, but when Ramsey had to step away from Acts Radio, Kevin stepped in. He had already added a gospel music station to his own endeavors, so it was a natural

move for him.

Acts Ministry Bishop Jim Wining rented an apartment next door to Kevin and a spare bedroom became Acts Radio and, later, Acts TV studios. When the AMG ministry moved from Branson to Springfield, Kevin stepped away and the current manager, Matt Pearson, assumed the duties.

Kevin met his wife, Donna, while he lived in Branson. She came up from Oklahoma with a group that performed at The Night Light Beacon, a Christian social club. He got involved with her music ministry and eventually they were married. "It only took six years," Kevin says, "to go on our first date."

Donna has strong military ties, too. Her father was a Marine and the family moved around a good deal until

his retirement, when they settled in Oklahoma. It was her father who, along with teacher her to play golf, introduced her to a wide variety of music, from country to rhythm and blues. In middle school, she won several honors as a soloist in choir, but didn't really pursue music until college. At first she had considered a Nashville career as a country singer, but in her junior year in college she felt a calling to pursue gospel music instead.

She has won several prizes for her singing, including placing in the top ten in The Singing News Ultimate Talent Search. Recently, she won the Horizon Female Artist from the International Country Gospel Music Association.

Donna has been a registered orthopedics nurse for 14 years.

Current, Kevin and Donna serve as pastors, along with Steve McAllister, for the Veterans Church. There, the two's military background is helpful in ministering to troubled military veterans.

Veterans, Kevin says, have had to deal with death in ways that most people have not. "I know everybody deals with death at some time," Kevin says, "but for war vets, that's a whole different level. The average citizen doesn't walk into the things these guys do. Sometimes when we're sitting at home and hurting, we pick up the phone and tall our best friend. But for the vet, sometimes the best friend they need to talk to died in their arms in some faraway land." They have to deal with "why me" feelings: "Why did I survive?" "Why did I make it home when others didn't?"

Suicide and self harm is another big issue. It happens to non-vets as well, but vets are a pretty small demographic, Kevin says, to lose 22 people a day to suicide.

Veterans Church operates pretty informally. "We do a lot more talking than preaching," Kevin says. "We feel that the vets who already know Christ are being fed by their home church; here, we're hoping to reach those who don't know Christ. We want to show them through our stories and our guests the love and friend-ship of Jesus. We also want to hear their problems and either help them or help them find help."

Kevin and Donna currently live in Ada, Oklahoma, but hope to move to the Springfield area in the near future. They share a household with four Jack Russell terriers and a Great Pyrenees. Kevin has three adult children, Thomas, a Navy vet, Kevin Jr., who is a five-year Army vet, and Sara, who is in management of a candy company in Kansas.

The Kilmurrays enjoy golfing and sports. Being from upstate New York, Kevin is a die-hard Buffalo Bills fan. About a year and a half ago, he introduced Donna to target shooting. It wasn't too long before she came home with a Glock of her own.
