ActsFest 2022 concluded July 17. If you were not able to attend in person or on line, you missed an amazing time of fellowship, great preaching, teaching, music and food. This year's ActsFest was a four-day event entitled "A Celebration of Believers." Dr. James Wining spoke about Acts Ministry and the various sub-organizations under the Acts Ministry cover, introduced our founder, Dr. Paul Collins, and gave a brief history of Acts Ministry, reminded us of our mission of "Unity, in Christ, through the Holy Spirit," and opened us in prayer.

The first day's theme was "Knowing the Holy Spirit". The first breakout session, "Guided by the Holy Spirit," was led by Bishop Dennis Eversen. He reminded us that the we need to walk in love, have a knowledge of the Word in our hearts, and stay away from division caused by the enemy. He also reminded everyone that without faith you cannot find God and the difference between works of the flesh and fruit of the Spirit.

After a short break, Dr. Paul Collins led a teaching on "Hearing the Voice of the Holy Spirit". The Holy Spirit, Dr. Collins explained, is the power of the Lord in us. Holy Spirit is God with us. We should all strive to hear and do what the Holy Spirit wants us to do so that those we meet can more fully understand our Christian walk.

The last session on Thursday was "Dreams, Trances and Revelations," led by Dr. James Wining, He advised us that the time for evangelism is over and we must now grow and share Holy Spirit power with those we come in contact with. The teachings on Thursday were all spot on and blessed all in attendance.

Friday, we listened to teachings on the "Messages of Jesus Christ" with Pastor Ladena Bough starting the day speaking about "Love and Forgiveness" followed by Pastor Billy Burris speaking on "Healing Mind, Body and Soul." Pastor Burris brought his accordion this year and he and his wife, Glenda, sang and played. Afterward, Pastor Steve McAllister sharing a

Calling On Good Shepherds

Calling all shepherds of the flock of Christ!

Mission: "To Do the Right Thing, Wherever Needed!"

Shepherds encourage believers in their walk with God, help others understand the teachings of Jesus and gain guidance from the Holy Spirit. This reporter was tasked back in May with becoming the first of the Good Shepherds for Acts Ministry. This is *not* preach-

ing or teaching doctrine, as such, but *is* an obligation to be obedient and attentive to the Holy Spirit. Shepherds will teach those who seek Him and help individuals navigate life through and around evil for the fulfillment of Jesus' work upon this world.

I, and the Board of Directors of Acts Ministry, are looking to appoint six other Shepherds to become the "Shepherds Council." These individuals will take a day of each week, or a staggered schedule throughout the month, for gathering and/or trumpeting to believers words of knowledge, comfort, along with words of the Bible and received from the Holy Spirit. The current task is to find shepherds who will take charge of one day of shepherding to believers through activities such as:

- Developing Bible studies;
- Social media broadcasting;
- Regular faith-based events such as "Every Friday is a Good Friday,"
- Gathering activities such as "A Day of Gospel Music;"
- "Who Cares Day" for veterans, orphans, disabled, elderly, or autistic persons, to name a few;
- Marriage and family time education and entertainment, and;
- Healing for diseases, including alcohol- and drugaddiction, or something else you think of.

I had the pleasure of speaking briefly with some of you during ActsFest about this concept and one idea was to provide a Women's Church. We have some amazingly talented individuals who might consider a weekly or monthly "jam session" or music performance glorifying God. Since we need to prepare the flock for what is coming, maybe someone is willing to host classes or shows on nutrition, cooking, and classes on budgeting. We must prepare the flock for what is coming. Remember the Scripture:

Rev. 13:16-17: And he causeth all, both small and

great, rich and poor, free and bond, to receive a mark in their right hand, or in their foreheads: and that no man might buy or sell, save he that had the mark, or the name of the beast, or the number of his name."(KJV)

I am asking that each of you send me a text or email with your thoughts on how to more fully use our Acts Ministry offices, our studio, and our contacts to help each other and the flock through this last season of evil against our Godhead. In this time of generating ways to more fully engage others, please bear in mind that we want to provide the flock with ways to get a "hand up," and not a "handout." We certainly do not want to cause more harm than good. Let's share ideas on what type of need exists within our flock. "Relief" can be defined as urgent and temporary provision of emergency aid, but relief is no longer needed when individuals have the opportunity to help themselves. After the crisis has been averted, it is important to move quickly into rehabilitation and development. These stages require the shepherds to move into a partnership role and allow those we help to participate and plan their own recovery.

While most of these activities can be accomplished remotely, it is important for safety, human cohesiveness and physical commitment, that all activities should culminate to or from one centralized location, and at this time, that is the Acts Ministry offices.

Acts Ministry may not be the total answer to the current unseen battles between God and evil, but it is the answer for those who believe in the vision of Acts Ministry, "Unity, in Christ, through the Holy Spirit." We should all remember that there will come a time of urgency, with a total absence of communication abilities, and, therefore, the planned and ingrained knowledge as to where to go is crucial, so getting the flock trained up during this time is more important than ever.

Human control has lost its "check," in evilness by "nuclear deterrent." Human leadership is markedly divided and weak in purpose and, thereby, is unable to lead. Fear has taken over economic improvement, and Christian principles such as trust, respect, and love have been replaced by divisive ideological slogans of racism, choice, socialism, communism and anarchy.

Boundaries of Jesus

Boundaries were an important aspect of Jesus. It starts with Matthew 5:37 "...letting your 'yes' be 'yes' and your 'no' be 'no." Trying to make people do things or to like you "comes from the evil one." Jesus simply wants us to be honest with others. You simply say a 'yes' or 'no' and speak it in love.

Boundaries define a person's identity. I have used the metaphor of a picket fence to describe this to my clients. I draw a sky view of a fence and a second fence which is a horizontal fence. The fence represents your identity which is your value system, each picket represents a value you have. Imagine you are safely in your fenced in area. You have a gate to this fence and you are in charge of who you let into your yard.

Rather than list them here, I encourage you to go to Brene Brown's List of Values. Print out the list. Then, begin to sort out negotiable vs. non-negotiable boundaries. Write each value on the horizontal fence. You will want to prioritize the non-negotiable values as some values, when the "pickets" are knocked down, will cause more negative feelings than others. It hurts to have someone kick your "pickets" down. You did not open your "gate" to that person. They just kicked your pickets down! Of course, your reaction will probably be hurt, anger, and often retaliation. The more "pickets" knocked down...negative feelings grow!! React in love? I do not think so! This is when Romans 8:28-29 are trained into us. "All things work together for good ...we will be conformed to the image of His Son."

The Bible is replete with God observing boundaries and identifying who He is. The Lord also tells us who we are, e.g. holy, peaceful, faithful, righteous, loving, kind, gentle, strong and courageous. The more we identify with His identity, the more we glorify the Lord

and His work in us.

Having good boundaries requires self-awareness, personal responsibility, and the ability to say yes or no reflects love for God and others. The goal in life needs to be to become mature in our identity, values, and boundaries. The stronger your awareness of who you are, the freer you are to make the choices to walk with Jesus.

Let our yes be yes and our no be no.

I actually think this is why so little is said in the Bible about having a good marriage. It is because a good marriage will always be based on His abundant guidance in the Bible about values, boundaries, and how to treat others. Love your neighbor as yourself. When one truly has Godly boundaries, you are loving yourself which inevitably causes you to love your neighbor.
