'Mom' to More Than 90 to Address Managing Troubles in New Show


"In the world ye shall have tribulation," Jesus warned in John 16:33, "but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world."

Overcoming tribulation and triumphing is exactly what Ladena Bough plans to address in her upcoming AMG show, Trials and Triumphs. Bough, who pastors Independence Church in the rural Stockton area, has had perhaps more than her share of trials, but they have been matched with abundant triumphs as well.

Before entering the ministry, Bough worked 30 years as a paralegal in the Kansas City area, managing a Christian law firm. During that time, she was a diligent student of scripture and she learned that her faith and her profession worked hand-in-hand to help her reach out as she encountered many marginalized individuals who might not have thought that the Bible could help them get through their difficulties in life.

Tough times have touched her family as well. She and her husband, Billy, have lost two of their own sons. Some of their other children have had issues with alcohol and drug abuse. On a personal level, she has, in just the last year been diagnosed with a brain tumor, undergone radiation treatment, suffered a horrible automobile wreck, and had a beloved niece die. "I'm the queen bee of been-theredone that," she says, "but I refuse to dwell on the bad and rejoice in the outcome of each situation. Those heartaches, while painful, served to strengthen my faith in Christ."

In addition to her own children, Bough has taken in over 90 children who were abandoned by their own parents. "I am proud to say that all of those children managed to graduate high school and get decent jobs before leaving my home," she says.

"They still call me "momma" and let me be the extra grandma to their children." She and Billy currently have two autistic grandchildren.

Bough's childhood home was Stockton, though she spent most of her formative years in the Kansas City metro area. Nonetheless, she has a deep roots in the church that she now pastors there; her great-grandfather pastored the self-same church when it was the Independence Free Will Baptist Church in 1916.

She has been associated with Acts Ministry since 2015 and is quite active in the organization, having won Pastor of the Year twice and the inaugural Jackie Scott-Phillips Service Award at ActsFest just this past summer. She has served on panels regarding medical marijuana and has taught in some capacity most years since she has been involved with Acts. Additionally, she puts her law practice man-

agement skills to use, helping ministries establish non-profit corporations and dealing with bookkeeping issues. "Basically, I try to help wherever I can," she says.

Recently, Acts Ministry President Dr. James Wining asked Bough to draw on her experiences and struggles to host an hour-long video series on dealing with the kinds of trials Bough herself has frequently faced. Thus Trials and Triumphs was born. Set to air on Wednesdays at 11 a.m., the show will begin in late December. It will air live on AMG outlets and will also be available prerecorded on the Acts Ministry website.

Guests, Bough says, will include everyday people who have handled various problems from suicides in the family, to disabled children, bereavement, and devastating personal medical diagnoses.

"My own life experiences," she says, "have proven invaluable to others over the years in helping to

guide them and teach them so they can pull themselves up by their boot straps and thrive in a world that seems to always want to beat people down. The world seems set on knocking down everyone at some time, but a simple change of mindset, knowledge, work, and reliance on our Lord will hold you upright every time. Our own minds are our greatest stumbling block sometimes and we need to acknowledge that and move on to bigger and better things."

They are experiencing their first or second holiday season without their loved ones. Divorce is huge, too. How do

the rejected ones enter into their family now? The spouse's family that was once their family? Others are estranged from their families and the warmth of a family is not theirs. My single friends wonder if anyone will invite them to gatherings or will they be alone. And, even when the wounded are invited, there is still this shadow hanging over them of loss. My heart breaks for them. The song comes to me, "Give it all, give it all, give it all to Jesus. Shattered dreams, wounded hearts, broken toys

The perfect Hallmark movie is not the reality for them. The Holy Spirit gives me a taste of the pain of my dear clients. And friends look for a strong footing and ask the difficult questions of me, the "why" and "how" questions, questions for which I have no answer. I do not know how to ease their pain. But I can feel deeply with them as they share their stories. There is One who does know. He faced suffering. He also prayed to God the Father to rescue Him from His suffering. The Lord Jesus Christ has much much love for those who are suffering.

What I do know is we all must trust in our Lord. As
