WAMH Foundation Offers Hope and Help Walk into With All My Heart thrift store in Ozark, Americana Theatre in Branson. Sometimes that leads to

Walk into With All My Heart thrift store in Ozark, Missouri, and you may think you've wandered into the home of a dear old aunt. In contrast to typical resale shops, WAMH has beautiful furnishings, wall art, and accent pieces arranged much as they would appear in someone's home. Other sections of the store carry kitchen equipment, clothing and books.

"We keep prices as low as possible," Andrea Carter, the manager of WAMH explains. "We are here, to help people, not to profit." Everything in the store is donated and proceeds go to help projects such as Harmony House, a family violence shelter, Big Brother and Big Sisters, Acts Ministry, and the Resource Center in Warsaw, Missouri. "Really," Carter says, "we help meet any need in the community that we can." She has had people come in who were trying to restart their lives and has assisted them in setting up housekeeping. Carter keeps an eye out for those who are struggling and often strikes up conversations with such customers to see how she can help them.

WAMH is open Wednesdays through Saturdays. A few volunteers help with the store, but Andrea and her mother, Donna, both sing with The Blackwoods at the

Americana Theatre in Branson. Sometimes that leads to scheduling conflicts. "I would like to keep the store open more hours and more days," Andrea says, "but we would need more volunteers to do that." At present, she says, it's best to check WAMH's Facebook page for changing hours and unavoidable store closures.

Beyond more volunteers, WAMH can always use donations of furniture, clothing and household goods. Nothing donated is every lost, she says, If she can't use an item in the store, she will find someone who can use it. She often helps women through Harmony House with clothing, furnishings and, she says, even suitcases to help them get out of an abusive situation. WAMH does accept monetary donations as well. Such gifts are passed on to other charities as well.

Carter started WAMH a year ago. What motivated Carter to open WAMH? Luke 10:27, she says, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself."

Anxiety is a feeling of fear and apprehension of the unknown, of what is about to happen. Examples would be a test or speaking in front of strangers.

I am counseling a woman (I will call her "Mary"). Her father was an alcoholic, her mother was in constant fear. Her father tried to kill her older brother. When I met her, she could not know what she was feeling. She was numb to all feelings. Today? She identifies her feelings and is courageous about sharing them with me.

Mary's father committed suicide when she was young. Everyone in the family blamed her because she did not want to see her father that particular day. If she had,

He's quick to attribute that to his dad, Bruce Pearson. He couldn't have grown up, he says, living with his dad and not had a sense of humor. Also, he says, he has always loved comedy and improv and that has influenced him as well.

Under Matt's leadership, AMG will continue to grow and change. "We are going to try new things and new concepts. We want to get out there and be more and more effective."

Matt may put in a lot of hours, but he's not complaining. "If we can help just one person know the Lord and change their lives," he says, "then every moment spent from start to finish is worth it."

Most Christians have either grown up in the safety of a specific church or denomination or have been welcomed later in life by a church or denomination. In essence these people enjoy the benefits of a group with similar outlooks and perspectives. This includes education, correction and socialization under this same framework. While touching on the Bible from different points or references the development of understandings in Jesus Christ, The Holy Spirit and God maybe quite different.

Obviously, Jesus knew this would happen when he delivered his last prayer in John 17:9-21. He prayed for all of us to come together as one as He was one with God. This is the vision of Acts Ministry in all that it does. Unity, in Christ, through The Holy Spirit. Given the differences between denominations, faiths, churches and non-denominational bodies of Christ the task and road to the vision appears nearly insurmountable. In fact, time and time again ecumenical organizations have tried to accomplish unity but have had little results.

From Anxiety to Trust

ine curiosity about Mary. I listen intently to her sharing and to what the Holy Spirit is saying to me. I do not give scripture out without the Lord speaking to me to do so in these situations. It is my belief that when a person feels safe, the mind begins to release deeper and deeper thoughts, memories, and feelings. Giving scripture too quickly and without the leading of the Holy Spirit can take the safety away. In His time, the "the safety net" is felt. What a joy that is!

Mary still recycles the negative experiences, a common thing to do. They are frightening, energy sapping and demoralizing. The self-condemnation did not allow Mary to remember all the positive things within her. She is remembering more of her positive qualities to-day as she speaks. It is a joy to hear her be positive.

I am teaching Mary the following stress intervention tactics:

1. Relaxation techniques: e.g. deep breathing. This causes the heart rate to decrease, breathing to slow down, blood pressure to stabilize, muscles to relax and the mind clears.

- 2. Start a daily stress relief routine. This means a quiet environment, being in a comfortable position. Then pick a meaningful phrase to focus upon. I let Mary choose her focus. Staying quietly in the Lord's hands.
- 3. Build a stress packet. Collect silly putty, a special fun picture to look at, red-hot candy, a simple, small hand puzzle, a soft material, favorite music. Put these all in a zip lock bag so it is handy. These can access the brain's centers to turn off the stress.
- **4. Boundaries:** when to say yes and when to say no. Mary is precious to Jesus as are all precious to Him. She

will experience His healing in the name of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit.
