

AMG to Present New Series on Autism

From a Little Faith to Joy in the Lord

Biblical counseling is a process whereby biblical beliefs, attitudes and practices of the counselee and counselor are used to support the counselee through a caring relationship. It is meant to correct dysfunctional beliefs, attitudes and behaviors that drive negative emotions. The goal is to transform by the renewing of the counselee's mind these negative beliefs, fears, and attitudes through His Word (Rom. 12:2, II Cor. 10:4-5). This is done as the Holy Spirit directs. And sometimes He seems to work at a snail's pace —at least to me.

All biblical counseling is best directed at developing and strengthening the counselee's relationship with the Lord. Simply put, the extent to which a person can trust in the Lord's love and guidance is the extent the counselee will be able to allow the Word of God to transform him or her by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, we need to assist the counselee to develop this relationship with the Lord. The quantitative evaluation is: do you and the counselee see the fruit of the Spirit developing consistently within them?

This truth of strengthening a counselee's relationship with the Lord is so important. I have a counselee named Jo Ann. When she first began seeing me two years ago, she believed she had no relationship with the Lord. She was suffering with PTSD. Trauma riddled her whole life. She did not come to me because I was a biblical counselor. She had heard I maybe could help her. She was ready to give up on her marriage and flee. She was raised thinking she knew about God but had been badly abused by her Christian parents. She knew God at the very least judged her. She wanted nothing to do with her parent's God. I started by listening to her doubts, fears, confusions. As our time went by, she began to feel His love, know His forgiveness, even His sense of humor. In our last session, she joyfully said she can now freely pray. She is no longer mad - Continued on Page 3

Who would compare the British Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain from 1937-1940 with USA President Joseph Biden of 2021? Prime Minister Chamberlain resigned in May of 1940 and died on Nov. 9, 1940.

Let us all come together with knowledge, faith, and unity in mind. The events in Afghanistan are a wake up call far greater than any of our special-interest domestic policies. As I say to churches and Christians around the world, let us come together in one accord, "unity. in Christ, through the Holy Spirit" *Now!*.
