#### ActsFest 2021 will meet in a new location, 4166 W. Kearney St., Springfield, Missouri. ActsFest 2021 Set for July 15-18

Get ready. ActsFest is coming and this year will be a bit different from last year.

Acts Ministries Inc. president, Dr. James Wining, says that this year, more than ever, ActsFest will be about equipping the Christian ministries Acts serves for "guerilla warfare" in the areas of evangel-ism and charitable works.

Covid has changed the playing field and, Wining feels, the laws and regulations that came out of the pandemic may not go away when the pandemic ends. ActsFest this year will focus on helping the subordinating ministries deal successfully with the new realities.

Most events will be held in the new ministry headquarters at 4166 W. Kearney Street in Springfield, Missouri. The Sunday worship service, a long-held ActsFest tradition, will be held at First Church.

Saturday will be a telethon day, with telethons for the Veterans Church, for Autism Awareness Support, for the various Subordinated Ministries, and a fundraiser for Acts Media Group.

## Psalms Can Help Relieve Covid Stresses

For the last year, much of the world has been filled with stress, isolation and uncertainty. In the midst of this are the social distancing, "stay-at-home" orders, and mandatory face masks. Then added to that the shutdown of visiting in assisted living facilities and the strict policies in hospitals. Dear ones died with no one around to love them. Babies were born without the joy of visitors surrounding the new parents.

The long-termimpact—biologically, psychologically, socially, and spiritually—of these preventative efforts is currently unknown. Many are settling into social distancing and mask-wearing as being here to stay, the "new normal". Even while we are beginning to see some changes occurring with the Covid restrictions, there is still the sense things will never be the same. Again, the "new normal".

To maintain psychological and spiritual well-being during this unstable time, I counsel my clients in a two-step strategy. I believe we need to cry out to the Lord in our discomfort and also maintain hope and gratitude with this new normal. Psalms can help due to the fact that psalms reflect both praise and complaint. Psalm 42 is one example of complaint that ends with the soul being told to, "put your hope in God, I shall yet praise Him." I call it a bipolar

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#### Real News Review Article of the Month Community Service Policing

Two conflicting issues persist for many police departments and for the general public throughout the USA. First is the increased cost of staffing a police force in the 21st century. Second is the apparent growing conflicts the police departments are having with the general public. With the extreme social pressure of COV-19, crime has dramatically risen and there has been a corresponding development of new social and racial tension between the police and the general public. Is there a solution for both issues that works for the police and the general public?

Not all crime is violent and dangerous to respond. Without breaking it down with data published as current but dated years ago, it is fair to say a significant portion of a police force is entangled with non-violet crimes such as motor vehicle, theft, burglary, embezzlement, fraud, public intoxication, and drug possession. In fact, these types of policing may not even require the necessity of firearms. However, their costs of policing are nearly the same as for violent crime policing.

What if we could answer both problems with one solution? Let us consider starting at the community level with a "Community Service Police (CSP)", officers drawn from the young ranks of men and women. This would be similar

psalm because it flips back and forth from AAAGH! to PRAISE!

Psalms often refer to three seasons of life: (1) orientation, a state of well-being; (2) disorientation, a state of suffering, despair, and hardship, and; (3) new-orientation, a state of gratitude and thanksgiving. As I work with my client, she often shifts between the phases. One day she is able to see the new-orientation, the next session she is despairing. This is normal. As we struggle together, she will be praising Him more each day. I call it a 80/20 rule. Eighty percent of the time, not so much. It is a balance of trusting in His goodness. All this is done by His Spirit guiding us. At least that is our goal!

The strategy I use from the Psalms for both me and my clients:

One: Select a Psalm of lament and thanksgiving (e.g. Ps. 13). Read it to feel what David feels. Take time to absorb the feelings.

Two: Apply it to a current situation, selecting one verse that captures your complaint as well as one that reflects thanksgiving/gratitude toward the Lord. Release the complaint to the Father and meditate on His goodness.

Three: Later, whenever a negative thought arises, simply

in nature to the Peace Corps, or a non-combatant military draftee. They would serve 24 months, be paid minimum wage, receive credit hours in college education, and be assigned non-violent crime policing duties.

This solution should reduce police staffing costs, improve time allocations for experienced staff to work on violent crimes and open the police department up to more participation from the general public. This solutionframed CSP should promote good will, educate the youth about police work and open and strengthen community cooperation in stopping crime. While there are many moving variables with the CSP officer program the objective is to answer the two problems of public awareness and public support. This is, hopefully, a positive step in violence control and public awareness.

acknowledge it—return to the two-step strategy of lament and giving thanks to Him.

Remember that, through this process, there is no condemnation from the Lord. You are perfect and holy and blameless because of the incredible gift God the Father gave us through the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. All things work together for good for those who love the Lord and are called according to His purpose. And this is His purpose: that we would be conformed to the image of His Son.

This is very brief synopsis of my working through this time of history. Hopefully it will help to help others traverse through this very unstable time.
