The song says, "It's the most wonderful time of the year," and it paints a picture of joy and happiness. Contrary to popular belief, the suicide rate actually drops during the holiday, but there are plenty of people who do not experience a wonderful holiday season.

For some, a loved one is no longer there. Others may be haunted by memories, good or bad, from Christmases past. Still others set their expectations so high anything less than perfect is a disappointment.

Many others deal with financial stress; they think they must put perfect gifts under the tree, decorate exquisitely, and lay out a mouthwatering holiday feast. Although by world standards the poorest in the U.S. would be considered wealthy in other countries, many do struggle to make ends meet throughout the year, and Christmas only magnifies their struggles. 





#### **Kidney Fund Update**

In December, Randal Phillips' medical team will decide if his current kidney transplant is viable or if he will need another transplant. Recent clinicals have been promising and the team has begun to address other related medical issues. Doctors at St. Luke's Hospital in Kansas City are working to repair the urological damages of nearly 12 years of dialysis. This is a slow process and may take several more months to complete. If the procedures fail, reconstructive surgery may be necessary.

Acts Ministry's Kidney Fund has begun to assist in offsetting Phillips' \$354 per month Missouri Healthnet spend down, This assistance will continue to help cover the costs of immuno-suppressants and other medical costs unless funds are depleted. Due to Social Security regulations, it is possible that Phillips' disability benefits will end before the series of procedures and, possibly, surgeries, are completed. In that case, Acts Ministry Kidney Funds' help with spend down expenses will become even more important.

Thus far, donors are replenishing \$150 of that monthly \$354 and Acts Ministry would welcome further contributions, both one-time and ongoing. ### **Debt-Free Education and Training**

Who would have thought the generations after the "Baby Boomers," would become inhabitants of "debtor's prison"? The cost of any education beyond public high school can soar to \$100,000 a year with a full four years costing nearly half a million dollars! Higher education beyond the initial four years in medicine, science, engineering and business can be, in fact, a multiple of the first four years cost. We need to eliminate "debtor's prison," which, for the young graduate, is a payment sentence of 5-10 years.

For years, we have rewarded business for innovative ideas in health, energy, construction and so forth. Business was given the opportunity to go into the public and gather huge sums of money based upon tax credits of one to three times the investors actual hard dollar contribution. The results have been mixed but, more importantly, we need to remember business doesn't think — people do!
